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- Provide leadership for the implementation of Maryland Expanded Food and Nutrition Program in ten Maryland Counties. The goal of all EFNEP's community nutrition education interventions is to use theory driven, evidence-based strategies to reduce risk factors for obesity; and increase healthy eating and physical activity, reduce food insecurity and improve food safety for low income families with children and children/youth. The overarching goal is prevention of obesity and chronic disease through life style related behavior change. EFNEP delivers nutrition education through a series of behaviorally focused, learner-centered lessons. Physical activity, food safety, food preparation are integrated in all nutrition lessons.

- In 2013, EFNEP partnered/collaborated with 330 community based organizations/agencies/programs in Maryland including, WIC, SNAP (Food Stamps), Head Start, Share our Strength, Social Services, Title I Public Schools, After School Programs, Job Start Programs, Faith-based Organizations, Primary Care Coalition, Community Education Partners.
- In 2013, EFNEP graduated 1821 adults (mean intervention per adult client/participant 8.0 hours) and 4720 children/youth from their nutrition education workshops in 10 Maryland counties/units including the city of Baltimore. More than 43% of EFNEP's clients live at half the federal poverty level and approximately 36% are of Hispanic/Latino ethnicity.
- Leadership for expansion of community outreach and collaboration with Healthy Enterprise Zone Initiatives, partnerships with community clinics, refugee communities resettled in Maryland, Title I Schools and Twenty First Century Afterschool Programs
- In 2013, EFNEP trained more than 25 educators and fully implemented EFNEP's National Web-based evaluation and reporting system WebNEERS which empowers EFNEP to collect and analyze data on a wide variety of inputs, outputs and program outcomes including 24 hour diet recalls, demographic data, race/ethnicity/gender/income, use of other public assistance programs as well as diet and physical activity behavior change from pre to post intervention.
